Through everything, Jefferson was affectionate, social, and showed his gratitude to everyone he met. After six weeks, Jefferson hopped into the heart of a rabbit-loving family who even take him outside with a harness!

Tandy was three years old when he was left to fend for himself by his previous owners. A compassionate community member began caring for him outdoors, but after he was bitten by another animal, she knew he needed to come to the Cleveland APL for care. This sweet boy needed antibiotics, laser therapy, and a lot of love as he recovered from his wound. Tandy was a vision of forgiveness and love, as he greeted every person at the APL with happy headbutts as a thank you. In less than three weeks, Tandy was healthy enough to find a home of his own.

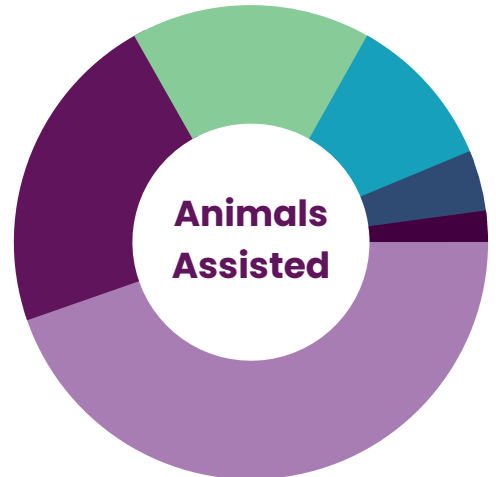

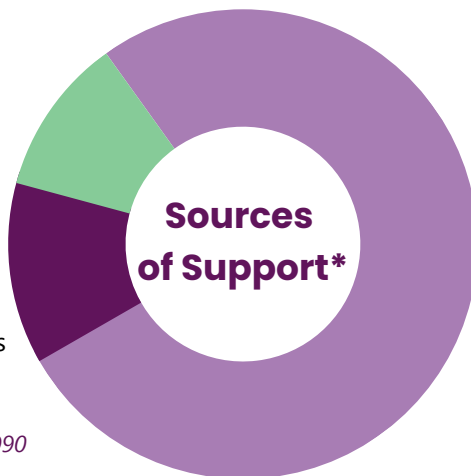

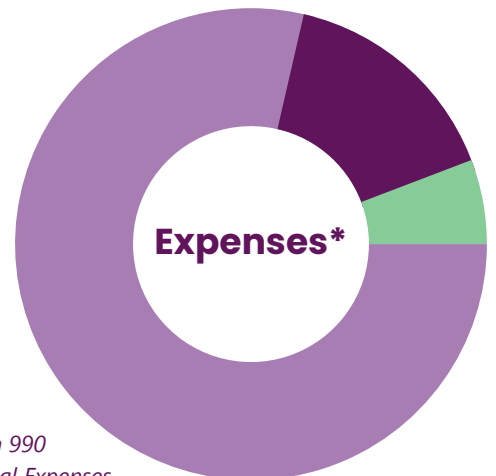
